Statement of Würth Elektronik eiSos GmbH & Co. KG regarding the use of „conflict minerals” in products referring to section 1502 of the Dodd-Frank Wall Street Reform and Consumer Protection Act (Dodd-Frank Act)

The Dodd-Frank Act refers in particular to tin, tantalum, tungsten, columbite, gold and its derivatives (3TG) mined in conflict areas such as the Democratic Republic of the Congo and neighboring countries. Furthermore and among others, it targets on the restriction and prohibition respectively of the trade of these minerals mined out of the conflict areas, which finance or benefit armed groups in the Democratic Republic of the Congo and neighboring countries.

Würth Elektronik eiSos GmbH & Co. KG is fully aware of its social responsibility with regard to environment, safety, health and human rights and understands that its business activities have impact on society and the environment. Würth Elektronik eiSos GmbH & Co. KG are committed to undertake reasonable due diligence with supply chain to assure minerals used in our products are sourced from conflict-free areas.

To achieve this goal, Würth Elektronik eiSos GmbH & Co. KG have established a conflict minerals sourcing policy.

- First of all, prior to the time of delivery of materials to Würth Elektronik eiSos GmbH & Co. KG, suppliers are requested to provide Würth Elektronik eiSos GmbH & Co. KG written documentation of suppliers' due diligence efforts. Such information will be disclosed to Würth Elektronik eiSos GmbH & Co. KG using the most recent version of the Conflict Minerals Reporting Template or in such other format as Würth Elektronik eiSos GmbH & Co. KG may prescribe.
- Suppliers are requested to record and maintain traceability data for all tiers of its supply chain annually and timely.

- Corrective actions are also required if minerals from Conflict-Affected and High-Risk Areas are used, Würth Elektronik eiSos GmbH & Co. KG will require suppliers to request their sourced smelter facility to be assessed through the RMI Conflict-Free Smelter Program (CFSP), or to remove them from preferred supplier list.
- Würth Elektronik eiSos GmbH & Co. KG annually generate disclosure report for 3TG publicly on website with the Conflict Minerals Reporting Template developed by the Responsible Business Alliance (RBA), formerly Electronics Industry Citizenship Coalition (EICC).
